sample questions for mentors

Doing a mock interview can help your mentee feel more confident in the interview space and allow you to share valuable feedback on their responses, verbal and non-verbal. Choose any questions that you prefer, or write your own, and use the provided space to share feedback with the student.

- Tell me about yourself.
- Why did you select UGA and your major?
- How would a supervisor or professor describe you?
- What are some of your least favorite classes at UGA so far? Why?
- Why are you interested in your area of study?

- What is your leadership style? How would you describe yourself as a leader?
